

## Drugs commonly used to treat multiple myeloma

If your patient has multiple myeloma, the physician may order one or more of the following drugs:

- bortezomib (Velcade<sup>®</sup>)
- carfilzomib (Kyprolis<sup>®</sup>)
- cyclophosphamide (Cytosan<sup>®</sup>)
- dexamethasone
- doxorubicin (Adriamycin PFS<sup>®</sup>)
- lenalidomide (Revlimid<sup>®</sup>)
- melphalan (Alkeran<sup>®</sup>)
- pamidronate (Aredia<sup>®</sup>)
- pegylated liposomal doxorubicin (Doxil<sup>®</sup>)
- pomalidomide (Pomalyst<sup>®</sup>)
- prednisone
- thalidomide (Thalomid<sup>®</sup>)
- vincristine (Oncovin<sup>®</sup>).
