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Quality peer reviews provide content guidance, evaluate clinical accuracy, and offer constructive comments that help the author improve their manuscript. Peer review does not involve editing for grammar, punctuation, or style.

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- Is the information accurate and complete?
- Does the information flow logically?
- Are any key references missing?
- Do illustrations, figures, tables add to the content?
- Does the author provide nursing implications?
- Are appropriate guidelines, standards, and research cited?
- Is the manuscript free from stereotypes, offensive language, and bias?

The ANJ executive editorial director oversees the peer-review process and makes final decisions about acceptance, revision, and rejection based on reviewer feedback.

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
